## **Concept Note**

In the Anthropocene, as we face unprecedented ecological and social challenges, artificial intelligence (AI) has rapidly reshaped our lives and intensified precarity. Literature and popular culture offer a critical lens to examine the complex interplay between Al and human existence, as well as the societal structures that shape this relationship. What does it mean to be human in an Al-dominated world? Cultural narratives, from literature to cinema, provide an unsettling yet crucial space to explore these existential questions. Other intersecting domains, such as language, policy, and economics, are essential for a comprehensive understanding of precarity, each contributing to the broader precarity quotient. While this workshop focuses on the reflections of precarity in literature and popular culture, it also seeks to interrogate the wider crises that exacerbate these conditions. By adopting an interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary approach, this workshop unique opportunity to explore precarity's manifestations, both within cultural narratives and across broader societal structures.

Digital humanities play a pivotal role in examining how Al shapes various dimensions of society, providing tools to analyze vast datasets of texts, cultural artifacts, and other forms of media in ways that were previously unimaginable. Through Al-driven analysis, scholars can identify patterns, biases, and trends across multiple fields, shedding light on how Al is represented, critiqued, and integrated into broader societal frameworks. Moreover, digital humanities methodologies facilitate a critical examination of Al's impact on cultural production and social structures, revealing shifts in narrative forms, thematic concerns, and the representation of human experience in an increasingly digitized world. Through this interdisciplinary lens, digital humanities help bridge the gap between technological advancements and their societal implications, offering a understanding of how Al reconfigures the socio-cultural precarity in contemporary contexts. This workshop thus facilitates a critical examination of how Al intersects with multiple forms of precarity, offering a comprehensive lens through which to explore the redefinition of human experience in the face of rapid technological change.
